Notice of Race

1 RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations Part 1 shall apply.
- 1.3 The class flag will be displayed three minutes before that classes start, this changes RRS26.
- 1.4 When rule 20 applies, a boat may indicate her need for room to tack or her response by hailing their competitor.
- 1.5 Appendix T, Arbitration will apply.

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 The sailing instructions will be available after 1700 on 18 March 2021 at www.takapunaboating.org.nz
- 2.2 The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and supplementary sailing instructions that will be on the official notice board located at [the middle floor of Takapuna Boating Club](#).

3 COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 The online official notice board is located at <https://www.takapunaboating.org.nz/calendar/2021-new-zealand-kitefoiling-relay-championships/>
- 3.2 On the water, the race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The channel will be 77.
- 3.3 [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The event is open to all boats of the Kite-foil class(es)
- 4.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing the entry form to Takapuna Boating Club by 16th March 2021. Payment of entry fee to be completed at registration.
- 4.3 Boats may enter the event by registering online at www.takapunaboating.org.nz
- 4.4 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.
- 4.5 Late entries will be accepted under the following conditions: Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the organising authority.

5 FEES

Entry fees are as follows: \$25 per competitor

6 ADVERTISING

- 6.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.
- 6.2 The organizing authority may provide bibs that competitors are required to wear as permitted by the World Sailing Advertising Code.

7 QUALIFYING SERIES AND FINAL SERIES

- 7.1 The event may consist of a qualifying series and a final series.

8 SCHEDULE

- 8.3 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race each day 13.00

- 8.4 On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 16.00

9 VENUE

- 9.1 NoR Addendum A shows the plan of the event venue.
- 9.2 NoR Addendum B shows the location of the racing areas.

10 COURSES

- 10.1 The course(s) to be sailed will be as follows: XR, XRS or XRT

11 PENALTY SYSTEM

RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

12 SCORING

- 12.1 3 races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 12.2 A team's series score shall be the total of her race scores.

13 SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS

- 13.1 [DP] Support person vessels shall be marked with the bib numbers of their competitor(s)

14 RISK STATEMENT

RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of

equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. **Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.**

15 INSURANCE

15.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$1,000,000 per incident or the equivalent. Certificate of insurance is to be presented on request.

16 PRIZES

16.1 Prizes will be given as follows: Prizes may be given at the discretion of the organising authority.
